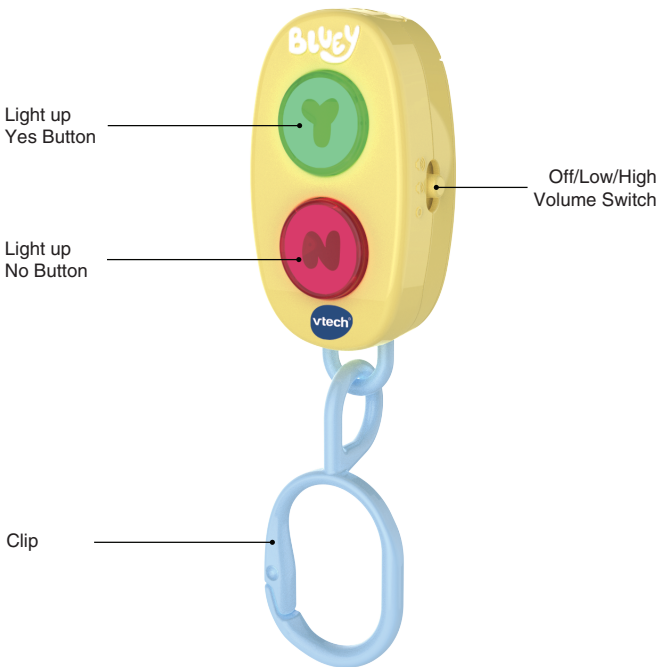

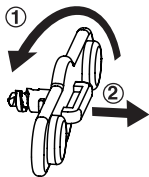
WARNING:

All packing materials such as tape, plastic sheets, packaging locks, removable tags, cable ties, cords and packaging screws are not part of this toy and should be discarded for your child's safety.

Unlock the packaging locks:

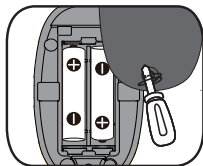


- ① Turn the packaging locks several times anticlockwise.
- ② Pull out and discard the packaging locks.

GETTING STARTED

Battery Removal and Installation

1. Make sure the unit is turned **Off**.
2. Locate the battery cover on the back of the unit. Use a screwdriver to loosen the screw and remove the cover.
3. Remove old batteries by pulling up on one end of each battery.
4. Install 2 new 1.5V AAA (LR03) batteries following the diagram inside



the battery box. (For best performance, alkaline batteries or fully charged Ni-MH rechargeable batteries are recommended.)

5. Replace the battery cover and tighten the screw to secure.

WARNING:

Adult assembly required for battery installation.

Keep batteries out of reach of children.

IMPORTANT: BATTERY INFORMATION

- Insert batteries with the correct polarity (+ and -).
- Do not mix old and new batteries.
- Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable batteries.
- Only batteries of the same or equivalent type as recommended are to be used.
- Do not short-circuit the supply terminals.
- Remove batteries during long periods of non-use.
- Remove exhausted batteries from the toy.
- Dispose of batteries safely. Do not dispose of batteries in fire.

RECHARGEABLE BATTERIES

- Rechargeable batteries are only to be charged under adult supervision.
- Do not charge non-rechargeable batteries.

Disposal of batteries and product



The crossed-out wheeled bin symbols on products and batteries, or on their respective packaging, indicates they must not be disposed of in domestic waste as they contain substances that can be damaging to the environment and human health.

The chemical symbols Hg, Cd or Pb, where marked, indicate that the battery contains more than the specified value of mercury (Hg), cadmium (Cd) or lead (Pb) set out in the Batteries and Accumulators Regulation.



The solid bar indicates that the product was placed on the market after 13th August, 2005.

PRODUCT FEATURES

1. Off/Low/High Volume Switch

To turn the unit on, slide the switch to either the **Low Volume** 🗣️ or **High Volume** 🗣️🗣️ position. To turn the unit off, slide the switch to the **Off** ⏻ position.



2. Yes Button

Press the **Yes Button** to hear 'Yes', occasionally followed by Bluey's reaction.



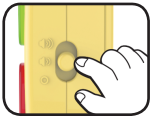
3. No Button

Press the **No Button** to hear 'No', occasionally followed by Bluey's reaction.



4. Automatic Shut-Off

To preserve battery life, the unit will automatically power off after approximately 70 seconds without input. The unit can be turned on again by switching the **Off/ Low/High Volume Switch** to the **Low Volume** or **High Volume** position.



Note: If the unit powers down while playing, we suggest installing a brand new set of batteries.

5. Clip

Use the clip to attach your **Bluey Yes/No Button** to your bag for on-the-go fun.



CARE & MAINTENANCE

1. Keep the unit clean by wiping it with a slightly damp cloth.
2. Keep the unit out of direct sunlight and away from any direct heat sources.
3. Remove the battery if the unit will not be in use for an extended period of time.
4. Do not drop the unit on hard surfaces and do not expose the unit to moisture or water.

TROUBLESHOOTING

If for some reason the unit stops working or malfunctions, please follow these steps:

1. Turn the unit Off.
2. Interrupt the power supply by removing the batteries.
3. Let the unit stand for a few minutes, then replace the batteries.
4. Turn the unit back On. The unit should now be ready to use again.
5. If the unit still does not work, install a new set of batteries.
